

Letter from your Editor



Hello!

It s a beautiful Spring day as I am writing this. Warm breeze, sunshine and buds bursting everywhere. Soon it will be time for my lilac trees to flower. That is my very favourite time. The lilacs remind me of my parents. The old song "We'll gather lilacs in the Spring again" was "their" song during the war years, and luckily my dad did come back from the RAF to enjoy the lilacs again. I have the three main colours of lilac: dark purple and white as well as the mid-lilac traditional colour. The smell is wonderful especially in the evening.

The birds too are up to their usual sex and violence in the hedgerows! I am pleased that my lonely woodpecker has found a mate this year - hence the topic of the cartoon this time! Since my Christmas gift of a sunflower seed feeder, I have even more little birds feeding here. I have at least four goldfinches which dart back and forth. They are messy or choosey eaters and on the floor below, sparrows, my pheasant and wood pigeons are all vying for the scraps.

Fat balls and peanuts are also on the menu for all the birds. When it is at its coldest, I get four or six long-tailed tits coming to feed. They are so tiny! I have chaffinches too, but where are the greenfinches that used to be so common years ago? I can spend hours watching the birds back and forth on my three feeders.

Birds frequently appear in my cartoons and have done for years. I have a tame pheasant each year, coming to almost hand feed, and a pair of crows, one of which has a damaged wing but still flies well enough. You're never alone with a bird feeder or two! Enjoy the Spring!

We commemorate Jesus Christ's ascension into heaven by celebrating Ascension Day, which occurs on a Thursday, 40 days after Easter.



By definition, upcycling is making something new from old materials by repurposing them.

It has been present within society since 1941, with Britain limiting the amount of clothing that can be bought, teaching people how to turn something that they used to love into something they can love again. And it has just become more popular!

There are many benefits to upcycling, personal and for the environment. If more people begin to upcycle we can continue lowering the number of raw materials used. It turns out that 59% of Gen Z are buying upcycled materials, with sources saying that the social media application TikTok is popularising the mindset of transforming old clothes. Recently, more people are adopting a unique style of dressing and upcycling is a great way to make yourself stand out! Kathleen's Kitchen

A Way To Use Up Leftover Hot Cross Buns (All weights & measures are approximate)

Ingredients

Knob of butter to grease a 1ltr/ 1 & 3 quarters of a pint dish 4 Hot Cross Buns (stale can be used)
200g/7ozs Lemon Curd
2 Large eggs
200ml/7 fluid ounces Double cream
200ml/7 fluid ounces Milk (any)
Half a tsp of vanilla extract
4 Tbsp Caster sugar
Lemon zest (as much or as little that you would like)

Optional - serve with cream or ice cream



Method

Step 1

Use the butter to grease a 1 litre dish. Slice the hot cross buns into 3. Using a generous helping of lemon curd, sandwich the buns back together & place them in the dish.

Step 2

Whisk together the eggs, cream & remaining lemon curd. Then sieve into a jug with the vanilla extract & 3 tbsp of the sugar.

Step 3

Pour the custard over the buns & leave at room temperature for 30 mins, so the buns can soak up the custard.

Step 4

Heat the oven to 140c-160c (oven temperatures can vary & you will know best what to set yours at).

Step 5

Scatter the remaining sugar & lemon zest over the top & bake it for 30-40 minutes until it is golden & custard just set. After you take it out of the oven, leave it to stand for 5 minutes, then serve it with whatever you choose!

Westborough and Dry Doddington Parish Council News

Flooding in Westborough - Environment Agency Meeting

Following the flooding caused by Storm Babet, representatives from the Environment Agency (EA) met with 40 residents, cllrs and Internal Drainage Board members. The discussion concentrated on flood resilience and river channel maintenance.

The EA agency failed to issue flood warnings due their systems. They were not taking readings from the gauges at Hougham, instead Colsterworth, which was too far away to be accurate for Westborough. The EA has apologised for this and will improve the flood warning system and modelling at this section of the Witham. A new flood warning area for Westborough and Long Bennington is promised in the coming financial year 2024/25.

The EA cited treasury policy as a barrier to secure funding for maintenance works, which would inevitably reduce the impact of these major storms. The Parish Council expressed an interest in self-help measures, including carrying out maintenance in the absence of any EA action. This was met with cautiousness and vagueness from the EA who also explained we may have to apply and pay for a permit. The EA have agreed to come and walk the Westborough stretch of the River Witham and advise on what self-help measures would be permitted. County Cllr A Maughan will try and arrange a meeting with our MP to push for funding to try and get some maintenance carried out.

Thank you to all who joined our annual litter pick on Sunday 25 February, as well as those who regularly go for a walk and pick up rubbish. Thank you for making a difference.





Interesting Places...

If you fancy a day out now the weather is hopefully improving, - or just stopped raining, you could consider going to the lovely small Lincolnshire town of Louth, especially on a market day, when the town is a busy, vibrant example of how market towns used to be. It's not too far either, although probably not easily visited using public transport.

Some interesting facts

Jeffrey Archer was the MP for 5 years

The Greenwich Meridian which marks 0 degrees longitude goes right through the town.

Our television pictures are transmitted from the Belmont mast near to the town.

Alfred, Lord Tennyson, the great poet was educated at King Edward VI Grammar School. A stone inscription to commemorate this forms part of a wall on Schoolhouse Lane in Louth.

St James' Church has the tallest parish church spire in England. Being the tallest building in Louth, it can be seen from many miles away on a clear day.



In 2012 BBC Countryfile named Louth as Britains favourite market town. Over 70% of shops are independent.

National food campaign organisations based in Louth include the Asparagus Growers Association, the Brassica Growers Association, the British Herb Trade Association, the British Onion Producers Association, the Leek Growers Association, the Radish Growers Association, the Turfgrass Association - who knew such organisations were needed or even existed?

In October 1536, in protest at Henry VIII's dissolution of the monasteries, the Lincolnshire Rising started at St James' church. The protest was unsuccessful and two of its main leaders, one being the vicar of Louth, were hanged at Tyburn.

Margaret Wintringham was elected Liberal MP for Louth in 1921, making her the second woman and the first British born woman, to take her seat in the House of Commons.

Some well known people from the Louth area are

Jim Broadbent, Julie Christie, Barbara Dixon, James Gillick, Patrick Mower, Ronni Ancona, and the least known UK astronaut - Michael Foale.

Michael Foale was born in Louth in 1957 to a British father and American mother, then raised in Cambridge and educated at Canterbury and Queens College Cambridge.

He is an astrophysicist and a former NASA astronaut. Veteran of six space missions and the only NASA astronaut to have flown on both the Russian Mir and the International Space stations on extended missions. He was the second Briton in space and the first to perform a space walk.

For a while he held the record for the most time spent in space for a US citizen. (Michael has dual nationality status) at 374 days, 11 hours, 19 minutes and still has the record for the most time in space by a British citizen.



On a space shuttle mission in 1999 he went on an 8 hour space walk to repair components on the Hubble Space Telescope.

Michael now lives in Texas.


