KATHLEEN'S KITCHEN



Strawberry Scones

MY OWN RECIPE: & **all weights & measurements are approximate**. No rolling pin or cutter needed. I used a Food Processor to make them, but you can make them in whichever way you would prefer.

This makes 12, by making 3 rounds & with a knife score each one into 4.

Ingredients:

8oz/226g of SR Flour

2 tsp baking powder

4oz/113g of salted butter (chilled)

3 Tbsp caster sugar (plus some for sprinkling on top of the scones)

1 large Free Range Egg

7 fluid oz/180ml Semi Skimmed Milk

8oz/226g Fresh Strawberries, hulled & roughly chopped, making sure that you keep back 3 very large Strawberries to cut into quarters or enough small in halves.

Method:

Put flour, baking powder & butter into the bowl & process it until it resembles fine breadcrumbs & stir in the caster sugar. Chop strawberries & stir into mixture.

Beat the egg into the milk & then add to mixture, but keep a little back to brush the top of the scones. Once mixed put onto a floured surface & cut into 3. Shape each bit into a round & place on a baking sheet. Score into 4 & brush the top with egg & milk mixture. Make a little cut in the centre of each of the quarters & push a piece of strawberry in each. Brush across the top again & sprinkle caster sugar on the top.

Note: My friends don't mind being guinea pigs & my daughter is used to being one over the years. I ask for their input & get honest answers. So on this occasion I thought that you would like to know what they said. Most of my friends & my daughter said they were lovely. One said I liked it, but thought it could do with a little more sugar, whilst another friend said it was nice, but it would be better with some chopped strawberries through it. So, it looks as if that one had missed getting them in the mix, perhaps more strawberries are needed! One other said nice, but I still prefer sultana scones*. Because I had enjoyed one when it was freshly made, I thought you would might like to give them a go.

FARMYARD TAILS

The 2 Kestrel's successfully hatched all 5 eggs and we have been keeping a close eye on them via the camera. The chicks are now old enough to be left alone for a short while. This allows both parents to go off hunting together.

Alan the Owl man came to the farm and inspected the other owl boxes. The Little owl's box has 5 owlets in it and they are all doing really well. We see the parents around the muck heap and sitting on the fence posts. Alan put the metal identification rings on their legs and placed them back inside the box. They will fledge in another week or so.

The Barn owls have only hatched 1 chick out of the 3 eggs. The female is our resident Barn owl and is over 14yrs old now, the one that hatched is doing really well and is quite porky. We are not sure why only 1 hatched to be honest but 1 is better than none I'm sure you will agree?

Alan will be back in a few weeks to 'ring' the Kestrel chicks before they fledge.

Along with the 13 breeding cows that are running with our bull Ragnor, we have 2 of his daughters who are now 3yrs old. These maiden heifers Pippa and Jess, need to be put to a different bull or artificially inseminated.

Another bull on the farm is not an option. If a bull can hear another they will spend hours both day and night growling at each other. We have used Artificial insemination before when our first bull struggled with getting the cows in calf. We purchased our straws online and they were shipped in liquid nitrogen to a Genetics company in Cumbria for safe keeping. They have been kept there for years so now was the time to have some shipped down to our local Ai technician in anticipation of either cow coming into season. We apply a special sticky pad onto the rump of the cow. We have put with them a steer who will mount them when they come into season and hopefully turn the sticky pad a bright shade of

blue when he rubs his chest on it whilst mounting the cow.

The general rule is if they come 'bulling' or in season, during the morning you inseminate them in the afternoon and if they come bulling in the afternoon you do them the next morning. However, Pippa had come bulling at some point during the night (after the late check) so having spoken to Ben he said he would Ai her that morning. We brought Pippa into the shed and prepared the crush for her to go into. He arrived at our farm a few hours later with a liquid nitrogen flask filled with various cattle owners Ai straws. We check the label very carefully. I have used one from a bull called Brogach 4th of Craigowmill. Pippa was walked into the crush and then the straw was carefully defrosted and inseminated inside her. It's an expensive option and the success rates are not brilliant but fingers crossed it will work. We will put a new patch on her soon and hopefully at day 21 nothing will be seen and she will be in calf. She will be scanned at 40 days just to make sure.

We are due to shear the sheep in a couple of weeks which is always a relief. We have already had a few with a touch of fly strike. The ewe will flick her tail and twitch due to the irritation of the flies and maggots so a close eye is kept on the sheep from lambing through to shearing. We spray any we suspect with a liquid that kills the maggots straight away and protects the ewe from re infestation for 10 weeks or until they are sheared. When the fleece is removed it massively reduces the risk of fly strike as there are no woolly hiding places for them to lay their eggs.

It's been a busy time and we are now looking forward to Hay making once again. How time flies when you're having fun :-)
