This service confirmed the finishing of our massive project to build a new path, servery and toilet. The service was well attended and concluded with refreshments from the new servery.

The project started around 5 years ago with an idea that it would be good to have modern facilities in the Church, and also to avoid worshippers slipping and falling on the muddy grassy path after rain.

Fundraising started in 2021 and continues to this day. We have used very traditional village ways to raise money including coffee mornings, concerts, plant sales, cream teas etc. Several of these events were held jointly with the Village Hall thus helping both village venues to raise much needed funds. We will continue to work closely with the Village Hall.

We were very fortunate in receiving a substantial legacy from a village resident, without which the project could not have been started. Additionally we were given many donations from other villagers both large and small.

We were very fortunate to be introduced to Dr John Manterfield from St. Wulfram's in Grantham early on in the project. John gave us invaluable advice including sources of funding and how to apply successfully. Our Architect Carl Andrews has been a great help in guiding us through the many obstacles on the way. We are also indebted to Sedgebrook Church for allowing us the use of St Lawrence whilst Holy Trinity was unusable.

The Church Council would like to thank anyone and everyone who helped in any way towards this amazing achievement. Well done everyone.

If you visit Grantham, blister packs can be recycled in Superdrug in the Isaac Newton Centre.



#### **BEAT THE SCAMMERS**

I am sure we are all working hard to protect our money from all types of scams. However too many times the Scammers still win! It causes real upset. So, here is some good news for a change. A new protection scheme called Authorised Push Payment (APP) scam was launched on 7 October.

This is where we're tricked into making a payment to an account outside our control and the person receiving it isn't who we intended to pay, or the payment wasn't for the purpose we originally agreed. If so, contact your bank immediately and you may be able to get your money back.

Take Five, a national campaign led by UK Finance, recommend three key points 1. "STOP" Take a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information. It could keep you safe.

2. "CHALLENGE" Ask yourself, could it be fake? It's ok to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.

3. "PROTECT" Contact your bank immediately if you think you've been scammed and report it to Action Fraud at actionfraud.police.uk or on 0330 123 2040.

#### LONG BENNINGTON NEWS FROM THE PEWS

A very successful churchyard clear-up was held on 18th May, with eighteen volunteers helping out on a sunny afternoon. Many thanks to all who came and helped the ongoing efforts of the PCC in ensuring this special place is kept cared for and well-tended.



In June, and at the start of the new school term we had the pleasure of welcoming the Key Stage 1 children and staff from Long Bennington Academy to St Swithun's. They visited the church as part of their 'Places of Worship' topic. Three year groups: Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 enjoyed a trail – answering questions about the church, observational drawing and craft activities. Art pieces from this session will decorate the church at the Summer Event. The children were beautifully behaved and showed a keen interest in what was outside and inside the building and how these link to Christian beliefs and practices.

Also, with children in mind, the West Loveden Kids activity, which currently alternates between Long Bennington and Claypole churches (and is open to all children and families, wherever they live) was held on Sunday 8th June at Claypole Church. Everyone enjoyed a lively session which celebrated Pentecost.

The Father's Day event at Long Bennington Village Hall was also held in June and lots of fun and challenging games were enjoyed by the visitors to this event. Thank-you to all who came along.

#### **CHURCH REPAIRS**

If all goes to plan the Church Repair Project should start on 14 July and last for 8 to 10 weeks, during this time Sunday services will continue as normal. However, the midday opening of the church to visitors - on Wednesdays from 10am to 4pm – will only continue until the repairs start.

The core elements of the repair works involve: inserting long metal-rod pins laterally in some of the Chancel and North Aisle walls (to bind the walls together); re-working some of the stonework around parts of the Chancel's East Window; and the re-insertion of the re-built stained-glass window panel in the East Window.

Fundraising for the project is still on-going; however, we have recently received notification of 2 small grants awards, and we await the outcome of a third application. In all we remain just over £10k short of our financial target, so our fundraising activities will continue; these include the coming 12th/13th July Summer Event and another Military Wives Choir concert on Saturday 11th October with a theme of 'Last Night of the Proms' - details of both are advertised elsewhere in this magazine.

#### SUMMER EVENT

#### LONG BENNINGTON WI

Over thirty members attended our June meeting where the guest speaker was Nancy Appleyard talking about Communicating through Body Language. If you see any members of Long Bennington WI looking at you with rather close concentration this is why – they will be checking out your body language! We can discover more about what people are really thinking by looking at their movements rather than listening to what they say. In Nancy's illuminating and humorous talk we learned the difference between rational taught body language, which can differ from culture to culture, and instinctive universal body language. Nancy has a background in teaching and anthropology and spent ten years studying and living in different cultures and communities around the world, particularly in Asia. She became fascinated by how people could communicate despite language barriers. It is thought that only a small proportion of communication is through the spoken word – the rest is body language. Historically body language evolved through animals and primates long before Home Sapiens developed. The area of the brain that governs emotion, colloquially known as the 'Chimp Brain,' also governs body language and so although we can sometimes use our rational brain at times to control our expressions and movements, as observers we usually rely on our interpretation of body language first. We know when someone's smile is false.





Nancy used lots of amusing pictures of politicians (see Photo), particularly Trump and Boris Johnson as well as the Prince and Princess of Wales to demonstrate how difficult it is to hide your true feelings. It was a most enjoyable and fascinating evening, and we all left more aware of each other's behaviour!

We also had a second handbook and jigsaw sale with any left-over books being donated for sale at the Lincolnshire Show.

Our next meeting on 1st July features the Lincolnshire duo, Patty and Dave, entertaining us with their presentation 'Flatlands: Songs and Stories from the Fens'. We have no

For, inevitably, in the age-old pattern of downsizers before us, we still have too much stuff.
